I met Clement Lacassaigne, a 16 years old student fond of art, fashion and sewing. In this interview, he gave us more details about it.

Hi Clement. has fashion always been your passion ?

 \ll No, I've been passionated for a few years now....I would say that I started to get interested in it around the age of 13, 14, in middle school. But now that I'm speaking about it, I realize I've always had this inner vocation toward art... \gg

And how did you realise it so young?

«I have always known I wanted to work in art because sciences and those kinds of stuff were never for me. I really dislike it. So I tried to discover all sectors of art as painting or drawing at an art school and finally fashion appealed to me as a revelation.»

You said you've always known you wanted to work in art, nowadays do you precisely know what you wanna do ?

« It's a big YES, my future is all mapped out."He says laughing. "I would love to go to a fashion school such as the Institut Français de le Mode or ESMOD in Paris in order to do studies of fashion design and scale modeling for 3 years and, after, I'll see. For the moment, I don't really know. The final dream is to be able to create my own fashion house in which I obviously would be the artistic director to create clothes, the universe that's to say the story telling of the label.»





So you speak about the fact that you'd want to create your label, are there any one inspiring you?

«I don't know. maybe Hermès or jewellery.»

Someone around you ? A close family?

« No, not at all, it's completely mine. I'm following my wishes. »

You told me about "haute couture", luxury and jewelry in particular, what do you think about fast fashion ?

« That's a huge question ! People consume too much of it, they don't realize the humanitarian and ecological disaster that it produces. The conditions of creation in brands such as Zara or Shein are alarming. We have to make them aware that fashion is still, it seems to me, the first or second source of pollution in the world. We need to move towards ecoresponsible fashion. In this kind of labels there is also a lot of plagiarism from the big one such as Versace. »



After explaining everything to him, he told me that he had to take the next flight to Paris too and that we could stay together until there. He took me to the counter and, fortunately, I was able to buy tickets for a (surely permanent) return home that very evening.
